



Paramedic Detention Project


- Program initiated July 1, 2011
- One of the few models in Canada
- Only model using paramedics
- Coverage on night shifts 7/52 18:00-06:00
- All detainees assessed either with a visual verbal assessment or hands on if condition merits


The Numbers - 2015

- Detainees Assessed = 8,098
- Visual Verbal = 7705
- Hands On assessment = 393
- Male = 5,948 / Female = 2,150

Y/O assessed = 1139

Next Steps

- Day shift coverage Implementation 07/16
- Frees up police personal from escorting
- Whenever patrol calls to have someone checked roadside, we suggest they bring them to detention to have the duty paramedic assess
- Frees up EMS resources
- Turns patrol members back to the street quicker

Emergency Department Avoidance

 EMS Experiencing Offload Delays in Emergency Department

Upwards of 160 Hours/Week

 EMS Made 400 Visits To The Lighthouse in 2014.

A partnership between Saskatoon Health Region and M.D. Ambulance Care





Proposed as a means to help decrease ED congestion for non-emergent illnesses and injuries

Presented as part of the 14-day challenge to SHR

- ■1240 LTC transports /year
- □>50% admission rate
- Average Length of Stay 13 days

- Launched April 13, 2015 with two LTC partner sites
- 5 week orientation period
- Operate 7 days per week, 0630 1830 hrs
- Since launch, 745 visits May 19, 2016

- Achieved over 85% ED avoidance
- 633 less ED visits as a result
- Estimated avoidance to SHR of \$196,000


