Toronto Statistics

Toronto EMS recorded 50 falls between 1999 and 2006

9 Fatalities*

18 Serious / Critical injuries

23 Minor injuries

CHIRPP Canadian Hospitals Reporting and Prevention Program 1990-2000: 362 children fell from windows Most were between 1 and 4 years old 32 concussions 43 skull fractures 52 fractured limbs

2 ¹/₂ yr old child fell 1.5 floors from window Result: MINOR



2 ¹/₂ yr old child fell 3 floors from window Result: MINOR



3 yr old child fell 3 floors from window Result: SERIOUS / CRITICAL





4 yr old child fell 6 floors from balcony Result: SERIOUS / CRITICAL

6 yr old child fell 5 floors from window Result: FATALITY

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6 yr old child fell 7 floors from balcony

Result: FATALITY



5 yr old child fell 12 floors from window

Result: FATALITY



It is easy to underestimate a child's abilities



Children begin climbing before they can walk

Highest risk group: 1 to 4 years of age CHIRRP

Building regulations for balcony furniture

National Building Code Safe Distance:

Openings: 10 cm (4 inches)
Railing Height: 107 cm (42 inches)

Responsibility Landlords Provide safety devices **Parents** Report missing devices Educate caregivers Educate children



Supervision

The single most effective way to prevent window and balcony falls is direct **SUPERVISION**



Educate Caregivers

Inform caregivers of your child's abilities

Show potential dangers

Inform caregivers that screens are <u>NOT</u> a window safety device

Set a good example

Children love to copy adults

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Leaning over..
Talking from..
Throwing items off balconies

...shows your child that this is acceptable behavior







- ✓ SUPERVISION
- Install safety devices
- Lock rooms that are not supervised
- Move items away from windows and off balconies



Safety Check

✓ Do a safety check with your caregiver

Set a good example

Be aware that window blind cords are a choking hazard



The Costs of a Fall

Highest personal injury settlement in Canada

Life time health care costs in excess of \$11,000,000

Emotional/psychological costs are immeasurable
