A Community Health Worker is as defined by the American Public Health Association as:

"...a frontline public health worker who is a trusted member of and/or has an unusually close understanding of the community served."

- Social-emotional support


What can CHWs specialize in?

- Building community capacity to address health issues
- Medication reviews

Benefits of a CHW on your team


CHW integration into an MIH team has many benefits, such as:

- Increased impact on patients
- Impacts on the community
- Impacts on the family
- Improved workflow from patient referral to completion of the program
- Unique team collaboration

Medication Review

- Recent American Association of Respiratory Care Webcast reports nearly
 - 69% of patients are non-compliant with meds
 - 45% of patients have inadequate knowledge of medications
 - 42% of patients are unable to self-manage their care
- Goal is to create a complete medication list, including supplements and OTC medications across the continuum of care

Lessons Learned

- Scope of practice
- Transitioning CHWs out of the Clinic Setting to an in home setting
- Learning curve on both sides
 - Training the Primary Care Providers and Advanced Care Paramedics to hand off
 - Training the CHWs to hand up



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
