

 - Support data analysis



 - Hamilton Social Navigator Program

Paramedic Services

 - Equalization across others

 - CPRPM, CP@Clinic, CREMS

- North East
 - Funding Cochrane, Nipissing
- North Simcoe Muskoka
 - Funding Muskoka*


OH East zone

Paramedic Services

- 14 paramedic services from Durham to Haliburton and east
 - CP programs operating in 8
 - Influenza surge, palliative projects, Health Links
 - Frontenac working with public health at safe consumption site
 - Renfrew CPRU

LHINs

 - Funding Haliburton*
- South East
 - Funding 4/5
- Champlain
 - Funding 4/4
